What is the Pilot Project about?

You are invited to participate in a pilot project funded by the UW/SSHRC Explore grant under the supervision of Dr. Laura Mae Lindo (Primary Investigator). This project explores Black student experiences with the Philosophy both in high school [Grade 11, HZB3M and/ or Grade 12, HZT4U]

and in university. More specifically, this study looks at the expectations of Black students who take Philosophy classes to better understand the under-representation of Black people in the discipline of Philosophy. To this end one of the research questions being explored is whether Philosophy is a space where we can do racial justice work.

What does participation involve?

- I am a Black student enrolled in an Ontario University.
- I am a student enrolled in a Philosophy Program at an Ontario University.
- I am an educator who has taught the option high school philosophy credit [e.g., Grade 11, HZB3M and/ or Grade 12, HZT4U] in Ontario.

Is participation in the study voluntary?

Your participation in this study is voluntary. You may decline to answer any question(s) you prefer not to answer by skipping to the next question and may stop participating at any time by not submitting your responses and closing your web browser.

Will I receive anything for participating in the study?

Collected data will be securely stored on password-protected computers for 7 years.
